## **Living Life with Purpose**

hen we were in our mother's womb, God created in each of us purpose, an assignment for which we were uniquely born. There are problems that plague our world, and God has created us to address those problems through the assignments He has given us.

So much of our lives are spent looking for ways to address our own problems. But in ignorance and unbelief, we use up God's resources trying to please and satisfy ourselves. A poured out life wants to address problems, and to be a solution rather than just another complaint or opinion.

## So, for your consideration:

Confession: I am who God says I am.

2. Ask God specifically for His assignments for your life. God created you for a specific purpose. There are problems in the earth that only you can solve. Ask God to show you what it is He has created you to do.

Confession: I can do what God says I can do.

3. Ask God to send you resources to accomplish your assignments. Ask God to send to you those whose resources have been stored up to bless you to complete the assignments God has ordained you to do.

Confession: I have the blessing of the Lord abounding in my life.

Lord, make me aware of the importance of my citizenship in the Kingdom. Let me not take for granted who I am, and what you have entrusted me to do. Give me revelation, wisdom, knowledge and understanding so that I might walk in the fear of the Lord, believing that God will enable me, empower me, and employ me to do and to be all that He created me to be; for His glory – Amen!
